You may have had your child come home and tell you that they are the class VIP but may not know what that means or what they had to do get to get this title.



Students are awarded a Dojo point for displaying our school values (Respect, Responsibility, Cooperation, Be Your Best) in the classroom and yard. This may look like; following adult instructions the first time, looking after school equipment, having a go at something even if it is bit tricky, including others in games outside, listening when others are talking, making sure you have everything you need to learn and letting others learn by not talking during class or disrupting others. (Have a look at our Learning area Expectation and Yard Expectations matrix for more.) Teachers keep a record of these behaviours and use this to decide who will be given the VIP award. One student from each homeroom is awarded the VIP of the week.

To celebrate these students' achievements, they are announced at assembly on Friday afternoon, where they are presented with a special LRPS VIP drink bottle and VIP pencil, have a special VIP chair at assembly AND get to choose their own special classroom job for the week. On top of all of this, our weekly VIP recipients will have their photo proudly displayed in our school foyer.

STATE SCHOOLS' RELIEF

Prep CSEF Uniform Package 2023.

UPDATE FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

Applications for the Prep 2023 CSEF Uniform Package are now open



What you need to know.

When

Applications can be submitted now and will close at the end of Term 3, 2023.

Eligibility

To be eligible to receive the 2023 Prep Uniform Package the student must be a Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) recipient. To find out more, please refer to the Department of Education and Training website.

What's in the package?

The 2023 Prep package contains the following items:

- 1 x Rugby Top or Hooded / Windcheater or Jacket (Bomber/Polar Fleece) or Long Sleeve Polo
- 1 x Track Pants or Trousers or Pants
- 1 x Pair of Shoes (Lace Ups or T-Bars or Sneakers Skate or Sneakers Velcro)

Please note the following:

- a) PE items are not included as part of this package
- b) Shoes must be requested in UK sizes (please see our shoe size conversion chart here)

Cost to families

Families receiving vouchers may be required to make a contribution towards the cost of the uniform items. The amount a family has to pay will depend on the retail purchase price and the State Schools' Relief subsidy (this will appear on the voucher).

The voucher provided by State Schools' Relief lists every approved item, and the maximum purchase value, that State Schools' Relief will cover. Families will need to check your school's uniform price list to work out how much extra may need to be contributed towards the uniform item.

Vouchers

All vouchers have an expiry date and must be used by this date. Please note that expired vouchers will not be re-issued for this package. Vouchers will be emailed directly to the school's specified contact person.

Returns

Items that are supplied directly by SSR can be returned. The 'returns' form can be found on our website here.

* Items must be in original condition and unworn. Please do not tape up shoe boxes.

Smile Squad is coming to this school

Smile Squad is the Victorian Government free school dental program.

This means all students can get a free dental check-up, preventive services, and treatment at school.

How to access free dental care

We need your consent before we can provide services. Consent is usually provided by a parent or guardian.

The electronic consent form can be translated into more than 100 languages, and the paper form is available in 13 languages.

Smile Squad dental packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) will soon receive a free dental pack to bring home. The dental pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.
