MUSIC

Keyboards, xylophones and soundscapes have been the focus of Music lessons during term 2. We have been identifying pitch, tempo and texture in music, as well as the timbre of various instruments.

Prep, One and Two have been matching the sounds of instruments to stories to create a 'soundscape'. They have also enjoyed experimenting on the keyboards and xylophones to create simple melodies.

Years 3/4/5 and 6 have been identifying notes on the musical staff and reading simple notation to play 'Funga Alafia' (a Nigerian welcome song) on the keyboards.

All classes have been learning a Karen rap that Nay Thway and Mrs Tonzing put together. We will be adding music and movement to this song to have it performance ready for term 3. The words and translation are included below for students to practise at home and teach their family!


Pictured: students strengthening their overarm throw.


